Have you heard about the Revised Roman Missal? (#4 in a series of 12)

How did the Roman Missal originate?

In the early Christian Church, many of the prayers that were said at Eucharist were memorized and handed down orally. Eventually the prayers were collected and written down by scribes. These books were referred to as sacramentaries (book of sacraments). Scriptures readings were recorded in other books and the Psalms were written in a book called the *Psalter*. Throughout the ages, as these manuscripts were passed down, slight modifications and additions were made. Eventually, all the chants, prayers, instructions and scriptures were organized into one book called the *Missale Plemun* (complete missal). The first book bearing the name *Missale Romanum* appeared in 1474, the year the printing press was invented. Following the Council of Trent in 1570, Pope Pius V promulgated* an edition of the *Missale Romanum* that was to be in obligatory use throughout the Latin Church. It was written in Latin and the texts contained in it continued to evolve over the next five centuries.
